DID YOU KNOW?

Christ the King Sunday celebrates the full authority of Christ as King and Lord of the universe.

The feast was originally celebrated on the final day of October, the day before All Saints' Day. Pope Paul VI moved the feast to the last Sunday before Advent in 1969 to highlight the day's importance.

One of the reasons this date is so fitting is because the liturgical year begins with Advent, which is the season of awaiting the coming of Christ.

Observing Christ the King Sunday at the end of the liturgical year celebrates and emphasizes the Kingship of Christ.

This title is not that of an earthly king but of a spiritual king. Christ's Kingdom is in heaven. His title as King does not bind Him to earth alone. On this day we recognize the higher authority of Christ.
